

Transit Visa - 3 Days or less

Transit visas are issued to foreigners who will pass through South Africa enroute to its neighboring countries.

Important Information on Applying for South African Visas

Effective 10 May 2015, applicants for visas will be required to apply in person at the South African mission. No appointment is necessary.

Travelers transiting through the following international airports are exempted from/do not have to be in possession of transit visas, but will be subjected to biometric capturing directly at the airport:

1. OR Tambo International;
2. Cape Town International;
3. King Shaka; and
4. Lanseria (Johannesburg)

Please note that the above-mentioned exemption does not apply to deportees. Please also note that foreigners who are utilizing land ports of entry to transit through the Republic of South Africa and who are subject to South Africa visa control should apply for and be issued with port of entry visas.

Checklist of Documents to be Submitted:

- Passports/travel document valid for at least 30 more days after departure from South Africa; The passport (including travel/emergency travel documents) must have: at least two (2) unused (blank) pages labeled *Visa* when presented at the Embassy or Consulate; one page for affixing the visa or permit by the embassy/consulate and the other page for endorsement of entry/departure stamp by the South African Immigration Services.
- A duly completed Visa application form [DHA-84](#) signed by applicant
Note: Under Permanent Residential Address, please state the address in Israel where you reside.
- Two (2) passport photos with white or light background
- Onward flight Itinerary
- Notarized copy of proof of legal status for non-Israeli citizens (copy of entry/exit visa valid for longer than 6 months)
- Certified/notarized copy of bio page of the applicant's passport
- **Non-refundable NIS 141 cash only for processing fee**
- Processing time is 5 business days and may take up to 10 days during peak season
